- Use the My McD's app to place your order when you arrive at the restaurant.
- Select Curbside Service and park your vehicle in an area of the lot that allows for other vehicles to easily pass.
- Complete your order by entering the **curbside stall number 99** and we'll safely bring your order to you as soon as it's ready!

If you haven't used the app before, it's simple! Beyond making it possible for you to order while we maintain safety protocols, you can save your favourite orders and re-order at the click of the button, saving you valuable time.
